- Unplug lighting when away from home or asleep


Fireplaces

5 REASONS TO LEASH YOUR DOG

1. **You don't know me.** Some people are scared of dogs, and some people are mean to dogs. For someone who's been bitten or isn't around dogs often, a strange dog walking up to him or her can be frightening.

2. **You don't know my dog.** Your dog may be sweet and well-behaved, but what about my dog? Maybe my dog doesn't care for other dogs. Even if she does, having an off-leash dog approach while walking on-leash can be scary for my dog. If your offleash dog approaches her and gets bitten, who is at fault?

3. You don't know where your dog is going to go. And go, means go potty. Off-leash dogs tend to pee and poop where they please, and that can be just plain un-neighborly. If you're walking the dog on-leash, you can keep her from trampling flower beds and direct her to go where it's more appropriate. Then pick up after her.

4. **People aren't expecting to encounter your off-leash dog.** Letting your dog off-leash can be

dangerous for walkers, runners, and cyclers and who aren't looking for dogs. They could trip, get knocked over or bit and your dog could get injured as well.

5. **All dogs are unpredictable, even yours.** Just like people, dogs have moods and emotions. Even the sweetest, kindest dog can get spooked or caught off guard or decide on a whim that they want to chase a cat. If your dog is off-leash when one of these things happens, she could run into the street or accidentally injure a stranger.

Be a responsible pet owner. Leash you dog and pick up after it.

EASY HOLIDAY APPETIZER

Smoked Salmon Bites with Shallot Sauce

Ingredients

- 1 sheet frozen puff pastry, thawed
- SAUCE:
- 2 shallots
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- FINISHING:
- 1 cup fresh arugula *or* baby spinach, coarsely chopped
- 4-1/2 ounces smoked salmon *or* lox, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup shaved Asiago cheese

Directions

- Preheat oven to 400°. Unfold puff pastry; cut into 25 squares.
- Transfer to greased baking sheets. Bake 11-13 minutes or until golden brown.
- Meanwhile, grate one shallot and finely chop the other.
- In a small bowl, combine shallots, mustard, mayonnaise and vinegar.
- While whisking, gradually add oil in a steady stream.
- Spoon a small amount of sauce onto each pastry; layer with arugula and salmon.
- Drizzle with remaining sauce and sprinkle with cheese.

Yield: 25 appetizers.




