The seniors worked so hard to earn their diplomas and it is heartbreaking that they were unable to participate and be recognized at a formal graduation ceremony.

With so many people staying at home, it has been wonderful to meet new people while out walking, biking, and working in our yards. Neighbors have offered to help shop for at-risk neighbors. Fire Department

Station 12 6-Month Update



Harris County ESD No. 29 is pleased to announce that the new Fire Station 12, located at 12734 Cutten Rd. has been in operation since late February. Engine 12, Tanker 12, and District 10 are all now housed at Station 12. While it may appear that nobody is there (the firefighters park their private vehicles in the back), it is staffed 24/7 by four firefighters and a District Chief. Fire Station 12 covers the west end of ESD 29, primarily west of Hollister St. and Champions Dr. and east of the railroad tracks.

With the addition of this station and the equipment, emergency response times have dramatically improved. While Engine 12 was housed at Station 11 on Champion Forest Dr., the average response time for the area was 6 minutes, 57 seconds. Now that the equipment is housed on the west end, the average response time is 4 minutes and 22 seconds.

You may notice the large tower of scaffolding you see in the back of the property. This is a training prop

that was designed and constructed by Affordable Drill Towers. The firefighters utilize the tower for multiple training evolutions, including high-rise firefighting, rescue basket operations, roof ventilation, and other fire and emergency scenarios.

Champions ESD now staffs 13 career firefighters around the clock between the two stations. Additionally, a new 2020 Engine 11, is now in service at the station on Champion Forest Dr. Please know that when you need us, we are here to serve. We want to express our sincerest thanks to all our residents and business that help make CESD a premier fire and emergency services organization.

KINSMEN LUTHERAN CHURCH / SAGRADA FAMILIA TO HOST HOUSTON FOOD BANK DISTRIBUTION, BLOOD DRIVE

To help the growing number of families in need, Kinsmen Lutheran Church, in partnership with Bridging for Tomorrow, will now serve as a distribution site for the Houston Food Bank.

The HFB Mobile Food Truck will be in the parking lot of Kinsmen on the first and third Saturdays of each month, including September 5 and 19, from 8 to 11 a.m. Anyone in need of food is encouraged to come. The site will initially be prepared to serve 200 families but can expand based on the need.

“When the opportunity presented for us to serve as a Mobile Food Distribution Site, the immediate answer was yes,” said Lynnae Schatz, Director of Congregational Life for Kinsmen. “Kinsmen Lutheran Church is in the community for good. Serving as a Mobile Food Distribution Site is just another way for us to serve the community—literally and spiritually.”

Food will be distributed through curbside pick-up as recipients remain in their cars. The church is located at 12100 Champion Forest Drive in Houston, 77066. Again, Schatz emphasized, the food is for everyone.

Blood Drive

Kinsmen will also host a blood drive in partnership with the Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center on Sunday, September 20. The Donor Coach will be in Kinsmen’s parking lot from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Appointments are required and may be scheduled through a link on Kinsmen’s website at www.kinsmenlutheran.org. Safety and Security

Extended hot weather is when most cities see an increase in property crime. We want to remind you to keep doors locked and windows closed and locked, even when you're home and even when you're working or relaxing in your yard, just as you would when you leave your home. Stay vigilant and prevent "sneak-in" burglaries over the summer months by following this advice and other key home safety tips.

Protect young people

- Have your children observe the curfew hours:
- Parents should be aware of where their children are going and set guidelines as to when they should return or check-in.
- Never leave children unattended or unsupervised near bodies of water. This should include area lakes, swimming and wading pools and hot tubs.
- Whenever possible and safe during the Covid-9 pandemic have your children take part in organized activities such as with the Park Board, local libraries, SSP and the YMCA to name a few. Busy kids are less likely to find themselves in trouble

Prevent bicycle theft

- Register your bike (or call 311) and record the makes, models, serial numbers and descriptions and keep this information in a safe place.
- Keep your bike, mower and other items you value in a locked garage. Be sure to lock your bicycle to a stationary object and make sure both wheels are locked.

Yard security

- If you're working in the front yard, lock the back door and garage. If you're working in the back yard, lock the front door and garage.
- Don't keep ladders or other equipment in the yard that could be used to gain access to your home.
- Keep shrubs, bushes, and hedges to a height of three feet or less.
- Residential lighting should be used to light up home entry points. Motion detector lights are an inexpensive deterrent for areas where continuous lighting is unnecessary.

In the home

- Pin your windows to allow ventilation but prevent them from being opened too wide.
- Don't advertise your vacation plans. Ask a trusted neighbor to pick up the mail and papers.
- Use light timers which will turn two or more lights on and off at predetermined times.
- Lock your doors, even if you are leaving only for a short time.
- The police also recommend conducting a home inventory, to record the serial numbers and other important details for your valuables.

Vehicle safety

- Park your vehicle in well lighted or supervised/patrolled places.
- Never leave anything of value in your vehicle. Even coins, sunglasses and cords may be a target for a thief. Take your garage door opener inside with you if you park on the street to prevent a car break-in leading to a home break-in.



The Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts is delighted to announce its Fall 2020 exhibitions, which open September 19.

Idyllic Times: Selections from the Gary T. Leach Collection of American Art will be featured in the Main Gallery, along with *Vistas and Voyages: The Photography of Don Pine* in the Rebecca Cole Gallery.

Born and raised in Des Moines, Iowa, Gary T. Leach says his passion for art collecting did not come naturally. He moved to Texas to begin a career in construction. Twenty years later he traveled to Europe for the first time and noticed the many oil paintings in the hotel club. One painting in particular caught his eye, and became his first purchase of an original oil. *Idyllic Times* features 30 pieces from his wonderful collection, which call to mind the simple moments that make life beautiful.

Landscape and nature photographer Don Pine is a native Texan who has been involved in photography all his life. His father was a WWII Marine Corps photographer, and under his tutelage Don first witnessed the magic of watching images emerge in a home darkroom. Don has now traveled to all seven continents and 74 countries. *Vistas and Voyages* showcases Don's ability to create portraits that capture the personality of both animals and people, and grand landscapes that cause us to marvel at the magnificence of God's creation.

Both exhibitions open Saturday, September 19, 2020 and continue through January 9, 2021. What's New with an Old Scam: Social Security Phone Scam Edition

With every new year comes a new scam, and so far, 2020 is no different. At the beginning of this year, the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) for the Social Security Administration announced a new twist on an old scam – the Social Security phone scam. By now, lots of us are familiar with the old ruse of menacing phone calls from someone posing as an agent from the Social Security Administration, threatening to take us to jail or initiate some other legal action if we don't pay up immediately. In this new farce, scammers are delivering this same back story in a whole new format...by email.

The OIG reports that potential victims are coming forward to share suspicious emails with very official looking attachments, such as letters on government letterhead and reports with official jargon claiming the recipient must submit immediate payment to prevent something terrible from happening. These emails and attachments are said to be quite convincing with varying details. I have included a few examples, and red flags to keep in mind when sorting through your inbox.

The fraudsters who send these emails will pose as government employees who claim to be notifying you of a problem. This problem could be possible identity theft or issues with your Social Security account, benefits, or number. They will then either threaten you with arrest or legal action, or alternatively, offer you a solution to increase your benefits, protect your assets, or resolve the matter of identity theft. The scammers will also demand payment in a form that, though they will not advertise, is untraceable; this could be cash, gift cards, cryptocurrency, wire transfer, or pre-paid debit card.

These letters and reports may look completely legitimate at first glance, but if you look closely you may find misspellings and grammatical errors. Despite the apparent legitimacy, the Inspector General has provided reassurance that Social Security will NEVER

- demand immediate payment of a fine or fee as a way to avoid legal action or jail time;
- require untraceable forms of payment;
- solicit payments or money in exchange for an increase in benefits or other assistance; or
- send anything with personally identifiable information via email.

Though the Social Security Administration primarily communicates via letters through the mail for official matters requiring action, they may on occasion call your phone. However, they will never threaten you, demand immediate action, such as payment, or suspend your Social Security number. Payments are requested through the mail and will include detailed instructions and secure payment options.

If you happen to receive one of these suspicious emails or calls, do not respond. Instead you can call us at the BBB Education Foundation for more information at 713-341-6141 or submit a report directly to the Office of the Inspector General at oig.ssa.gov.
